Dr. Turner then reviewed the results of the 2008-2009 Violence and Vandalism Report and the actions taken by the administration.

Afterwards, Mr. Tonzola reviewed his agenda items. Mr. Tonzola wanted to thank both Josephine Palmieri and Sandy Lampinen for their help with the audit.
