The General Music and Pull-Out Ensemble curricula are based upon a combination of the following resources:

THE MUSIC CONNECTION K through 8th Grade Editions by Silver Burdett Ginn offer songs for listening, singing, playing various instruments, dancing and moving, and reading music. This series is used mostly with PreK through 3rd Grade as they are doing much more singing than 4th Grade and higher General Music classes. For the Kindergarten and 1st Grade levels there are "Big Books" for visual aids to supplement each lesson. From 2nd Grade and up there are student song books for the children to read the lyrics and notation on their own or with a partner.

HAL LEAONARD GUITAR METHOD BOOK SERIES is used in the General Music classes and Guitar Ensemble lessons. This series offers methods of playing and reading guitar melodies and chords one string at a time. The songs and exercises featured in this book are also adaptable for Boomwhackers and Keyboards for General Music 4th through 8th Grade.

TRADITION OF EXCELLENCE SERIES by Neil A. Kjos Music Company is our method for concert band instruments. The songs and exercises in this series are also adaptable for Boomwhackers, Keyboards, and Guitars in our General Music lessons.

THE COMPLETE CHORAL WARM-UP BOOK - ALFRED MUSIC COMPANY by Russell Robinson and Jay Althouse is our vocal method for General Music and Chorus. This all inclusive handbook offers a wide variety of vocal/ear training workouts for the young singer.

RECORDER EXPLORER - THE HILLMAN RECORDER BOOK FOR BEGINNERS is our core Recorder method for 2nd and 3rd Grades in General Music. This series offers excellent songs for singing and playing on the recorder, developing skills for reading and playing wind instruments.

iPad Applications used in General Music lessons include ABC Music, Music For Little Mozarts (MLM), Music Theory Pro, Cadenza, Metronome, and FunkBox Drum Machine.

iPad is also used regularly in 4th through 8th Grade General Music for recording and reviewing student progress throughout each instrument unit.

In 4th Grade students are eligible to join the Bleacher Breakers or Chorus at the start of the school year.

Bleacher Breakers is a percussion Pep-Band who performs at all of our Boys and Girls home basketball games. This group introduces the pull-out lesson program and is a prerequisite for Beginner Band members.

Beginner Band starts after Basketball season closes. Students from 4th Grade and higher start their journey here on Flute, Clarinet, Trumpet or Percussion (pitched and non-pitched).

Intermediate Band is for students who have completed a full year in Beginner Band. At this level students who have played Flute or Clarinet may switch to Alto Saxophone and Trumpet students may switch to Trombone. These and all instrument selections for students are made under the guidance of the Music Director.

Advanced Band is our highest level of players who have excelled on the two previous levels of our band. The Advanced Band performs at several town functions through the year including Veterans Day and Memorial Day.

Chorus is for students 4th Grade and higher. This group also performs with the Advanced Band at town and community events throughout the school year.

Percussion Ensemble focuses on music composed for novelty instruments such as brooms, buckets, balloons and basketballs to name a few.

Guitar Ensemble is our newest addition to the pull-out lesson groups. Being that students are experiencing guitar methods for their first time in 4th Grade General Music, students in 5th Grade and higher are eligible for this group.

All of the above groups perform in various capacities in our Annual Winter and Spring Concerts. Students of all ages and ensembles perform monthly next door at the Ascension Church Senior group meetings. A different group is chosen each month by the Music Director.

# World Language

Students from pre-kindergarten (since 2015) to 8th grade are introduced to the beauty of the Spanish language through the four basic communication skills of language learning: listening, speaking, reading, and writing, with an emphasis on the oral and aural skills.

Each of the lessons is built around a cultural theme and is divided into sections of dialogues, storytelling, pronunciation, vocabulary, grammatical structure, and review drills. The approach is multimedia.

All objectives are practiced with the goal of communicative and cultural awareness.

# World Language

The general goals for this change in the curriculum is for native Spanish speakers to:

- Acquire pride in their home language and culture;
- Come in contact with a variety of cultural differences
- Distinguish between formal and informal language registers, and their appropriate domains;
- Read with comprehension and enjoyment;
- Write extensively on materials and topics presented orally or within their experience;
- Become familiar with the educational and career opportunities of Spanish-English bilingualism.
